## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

### **Please Read Rules and Regulations Carefully For Your Benefit.**

1. All purebred Connemara, Fell, Dales, Highland, (British) Shetland, New Forest, Dartmoor, and Exmoor ponies that are already registered in a UK-recognized Mountain & Moorland main studbook are automatically eligible for Mountain and Moorland classes." Welsh Ponies are not eligible for the Mountain and Moorland Classes at this show.
2. Exhibitors, parents and/or guardians of minor exhibitors shall indemnify and hold harmless the Welsh Pony and Cob Association of California, Inc., the WPCSA and Brookside Equestrian Park, their officers, employees, and/or all Horse Show Officials and Employees from any and all liability resulting from injury and/or loss sustained by any person, child, or ward of such parent/guardian, in any manner occasioned.
3. **SAFETY FIRST:** The safety of our exhibitors, their animals, and the public is our highest concern. Please keep your animals under control at all times and do not put them in dangerous situations. Be especially mindful of children, either inside or outside the show ring. **For animals in harness, animals must be fully bridled while hitching and unhitching. Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitched anywhere on the show grounds will result in the instant elimination and removal from the show grounds.**
4. **Junior exhibitors must wear approved protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) at all times whenever mounted or in a driven vehicle at all times while on the show ground. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is in place.**
5. **EARLY ENTRY BONUS:** Take advantage of our Early Entry Bonus! All entries postmarked by August 26th will be eligible for our early entry bonus. Early entries will be eligible for an early entry drawing for a free stall and other prizes, will be included in the show program Entries will be accepted without post entry penalty though September 8, 2010.
6. **POST ENTRIES: Post entries are accepted only up to 2 hours before your class session begins. No post entries for In-Hand classes will be accepted after 8 p.m. Thursday, September 16 for the Pacific Coast Classic.** Post entry fee \$5/class after September 8, 2010. Substitutions: Pony or class substitutions are not considered Post entries, but will be charged one \$10 substitution fee.
7. **Juniors are NOT allowed to show stallions.** Any unruly animal may be asked to leave the show.
8. **Payment of Fees:** A completed and signed check must accompany entries. (No Open Checks with entries, please). Exhibitors will be required to leave an open check with any changes/additions/orders that are made at the show. Returned checks will be subject to a \$25 fee, and must be cleared within 30 days of the last day of the show, or disciplinary actions will be sought through the WPCSA.
9. **Refund Policy:** Full refunds will be given if written notice is received by the Show Secretary before the closing of entries (September 8, 2010). Exhibitors scratching a pony for any reason after the closing date shall forfeit all entry and association fees, UNLESS a valid Veterinarian's or Doctor's certificate of disability for entered pony or rider is submitted to the Show Secretary PRIOR to the first event of the show, in which case a \$30.00 fee will be assessed. If illness or injury after the start of the show should prevent exhibitor's participation in the balance of entered classes, a refund of unused class fees will be made, less a \$30.00 office fee, providing the balance of the classes are officially scratched and a Doctor's certificate is provided within 48 hours of the close of the show. Association fees will not be refunded.
10. **Any abuse toward a pony/cob/half-Welsh or show official will be cause for immediate ejection from the show without refund.**
11. All dogs **must** be on leash or secured at all times.
12. Management reserves unto itself the right to refuse or cancel any entries, disqualify riders, drivers, or exhibitors without incurring claim for damages. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy and/or disobedience to the judges, officials, staff or committee on the part of the owner, rider or groom shall disqualify the animal and the owner will forfeit his/her entry and other fees.
13. **Two (2) minute Gate Rule:** To be strictly enforced. Additional three (3) minutes will be allowed for requested tack change. The Gate will not be held for more than five (5) minutes.

14. Stalls/Tack Rooms: \$85 - stall; \$70 Tack Room. Show grounds will open Tuesday, September 14, 2010.
15. Camping: RV Hookup includes Water & Electricity - \$125.00 for the show. Dry camping (sleeping on show grounds, no water, no electricity), \$20/night.
16. Shavings: Order from Brookside Equestrian Park (order form attached). Pre-order, \$8.50/bale. All shavings orders received after September 8th will be charged \$10/bale.
17. A variety of good food is available on the show grounds. Special dining events will be held each evening.
18. Veterinarian, Farrier, Medical – all listed in Show Office.
19. Exhibitor's Dinner will be held Saturday evening. \$12/dinner.
20. Office Hours: Will be posted at the Show Office.

## **CLASS DESCRIPTIONS**

---

The following are NPS show rules and will be followed as general guidance. These are the rules the UK judge will expect to be followed. USEF rules will prevail in a conflict.

### **2.1 GENERAL PRINCIPLES:**

- a) The age of the pony is calculated from January 1<sup>st</sup> in the year of its birth.
- b) All ridden ponies must be four years old or over.
- c) No Ridden pony to be shown on a leading rein except those entered in Leading Rein classes.
- d) The judge may require that a pony which constitutes a danger leaves the ring; the judge's decision is final.

### **2.2 MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND PONIES.**

- a) All ponies exhibited in M&M classes must be registered in the main body of the Pure Bred M&M Stud Book of their respective breeds at the time of entry and entered in the name and ownership under which they have been registered.
- b) All ponies exhibited in M&M classes are to be trimmed only within their Breed Society specification. Manes must not be plaited and tails not braided. Ponies are restricted to the height limits laid down by their appropriate Breed Societies and may be measured at the judge's discretion.
- c) Large Breeds must not exceed 148cms, with the exception of Dales and Welsh Section D Cobs for which the respective Breed Society definition includes larger height ponies.

### **2.6 BRIDLES AND BITS:**

- a) Where there are no specific rules relating to use of bridles and bits in the Rules Book (either in this section or in the rules for the particular competition) the judge can take into account the suitability of the bridle and bit, based on the rider's competence and the way the pony is going in the class.
- b) All ponies in Leading Rein classes must be shown in one of the snaffle bits illustrated in the Rules Book. The leading rein must be attached to the noseband only and the reins must go directly from the bit to the rider's hands. There must be no extra attachment to the saddle with the exception of a crupper.
- c) All stallions and colts 2 years old or over must be adequately bitted.
- d) M&M brood mares may be shown in a halter, leather head collar or any bridle.
- e) M&M youngstock may be shown in a halter, leather head collar or snaffle bridle.
- f) All foals must be shown in a halter or leather head collar. No foal may be shown in a bit of any type.

### **2.9 FOALS:**

- a) All foals must be at least three weeks old on the day of the show and must accompany their dam into the ring and be led alongside the mare as much as possible.
  - Foals must only be shown in a halter or head collar
  - No foal to be shown in a bit of any type
  - No foal to be lunged
  - No foal to be body clipped

### **3.3 ATTIRE AND EQUIPMENT:**

- a) Correctly secured current ASTM/SEI approved riding helmets must be worn at all times when mounted (including Side Saddle classes). A rider whose hat comes off, or chin strap comes undone, whilst competing must, on penalty of elimination, replace it or fasten it before continuing. He/she may dismount without penalty to recover the hat or have it passed up from the ground, or may stop without penalty to fasten the chin strap.
- b) Riders, handlers and their grooms must, at all times, present themselves in the show ring neatly and smartly dressed.
- c) It is recommended that riders of M&M ponies wear tweed jackets.
- d) Whips/canes must not exceed an overall length of 76 cms (30 inches) and if they are misused, in the opinion of the judge, the rider may be sent out of the ring and may also be reported to the NPS Disciplinary Committee

- e) The wearing of spurs in all NPS affiliated classes, or when warming up for NPS affiliated classes, is forbidden.
- f) Riders are not permitted to wear earrings and/or body studs.
- g) A fall of pony or rider in any class will result in disqualification. The rider must not remount in the ring.
- h) No change of rider/handler will be allowed throughout a class except where a rider/handler is incapacitated and the judge gives permission for the change.
- i) The rider/handler may not remove their pony or themselves from the ring during judging, without the judge's permission. The class ends when the judge dismisses the class.
- j) Where a rider qualifies more than one pony for a championship they must elect eligible substitute riders for the other ponies for the championship.
- k) When judging M&M classes judges should take into consideration whether ponies have been trimmed within their Breed Society specification; manes must not be plaited and tails must not be braided.
- l) When judging M&M classes riding/manners and conformation/Breed type should be marked equally with 50% for each.**
- m) When judging Brood Mare classes, judges must take the condition of the foal into account.

### DIRECTIONS TO SHOWGROUNDS

From Hwy. #99: Follow your Map Quest Directions to the Sacramento Area and get onto Hwy. 99. Coming from the North, take the Sheldon Road Exit, go east over the freeway and stay on Sheldon until it dead ends into Grant Line Road. Turn left and go approximately ½ to ¾ mile to Brookside Equestrian Park (big sign at driveway) and turn right – go to the end and you will be there.

Coming from the South, take Grant Line Road, go east (north-east) approximately 6 miles to Bradley Ranch Road. This will be a short distance from the intersection of Wilton Road, and Sheldon Feed is on the left side of the road by the railroad tracks.

From Comfort Inn & Suites: (located at Hwy. #99 and Twin Cities Road) Hwy #99 north to Grant Line Road, take off ramp to right, and go to stop light. Turn left onto Grant Line Road, and follow above directions.
